Weekly Classes

Class Description and Times:

Weekly classes provide tuition of traditional djembe/dundun rhythms from West Africa. Class teacher, Kate Gascoyne, is a qualified teacher and performs regularly in Canberra with the group 'Drumassault'. Kate has studied and performed with master drummers and undertook an intensive drumming and dance study in Ghana, West Africa.

There are two classes and in both classes students will learn the calls, djembe and dundun parts, breaks and solo phrases of traditional West African rhythms. Both classes are designed for continuing students however at the beginning of each term, the 6.15pm class accommodates first-time drummers or drummers who are new to West African drumming.



WEDNESDAY 6.15 – 7.45pm, starting 3 February and finishing 7 April* (10 weeks)



WEDNESDAY 8.00 – 9.30pm, starting 3 February and finishing 7 April* (10 weeks)

*Please note that the final session (7 April) will be a combined class rehearsal and performance for family and friends to attend.

Location:

Weekly classes are conducted in the hall at the Canberra Baptist Church, Currie Crescent, Kingston, Canberra.

How to Enrol:

When Drum Effect confirms that a place is available for you, you can then secure your place in the class by paying the term fee. Please note that places are limited and classes are often full before the term commences.

Fees:

TERM FEE \$200 upfront payment if you have your own drum (payment due at the first class)
 \$230 upfront payment if you need to hire a drum (payment due at the first class)
WEEKLY FEE* \$25 casual attendance fee if you have your own drum (payment due each time you attend)
 \$30 casual attendance fee if you need to hire a drum (payment due each time you attend)
Full-time students are entitled to a 25% discount (student card must be shown to receive the discount).

*Please note that priority is given to upfront term fee paying students and placements are secured as payments are received. Depending on the number of full term enrolments, casual positions may become available – you can register your interest in being notified of a vacant casual position.
